THE FUNCTIONS OF THE CELL

- Prepares an examination calendar for the whole academic year.
- Prepares modalities for collection of fees from students.
- Prepares the time table for the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations,
- ❖ Announces Seating arrangement in the Examination halls.
- Notifies the students and staff about the examinations dates and time tables.
- ❖ Takes the necessary confidential steps to prepare the question paper for the semester end examinations well in advance
- Takes necessary steps for distribution of answer sheets and question papers and award lists
- ❖ Invites all the departments to submit their list of courses along with the pattern of examination and the list of students who completed the course

- Prepares Marks Memos of various examinations from distributes them to the students.
- Analyzes all examination results with the Principal academic committees, prepares necessary reports to be submitted to authorities from time to time
- Maintains all records pertaining to examinations.
- Prepares consolidated marks register along with the duly filled provisional certificates and submits to the University for approval.
- ❖ Addresses the grievances of students related to examination issues.

SOFT WARE FOR THE EXAMINATION PROCEDURES

The software for the total examination procedure was introduced to avoid manual procedures and man made errors. The software was designed and managed by Manasa Solutions, Tenali. Once the data of students was entered, the further out puts like fee applications, Hall tickets, results, percentages, marks memos and provisional certificates can be printed automatically through proper procedures.

ESTABLISHMENT OF EQUIPMENT

- 1. The Examination cell is equipped with five computers, two laser printers and two Xerox copiers.
- 2. During the academic year 2017-18 one Master Server was purchased with Autonomy grant.
- 3. It is proposed to strengthen the examination Cell with a master server from autonomous funds to conduct online examinations.
- 4. One canon copier from exam cell funds and one Air conditioner from autonomy funds were purchased during 2018-19.

EXAMINATION REFORMS

- 1. Online examination system is to be introduced in selected subjects from this academic year 2019-20. For this purpose one online examination center is established with one master Server and 20 computer systems with the assistance of UGC autonomy funds.
- 2. For the automation of examination cell software was purchased to conduct internal evaluation and for mapping of results data for social welfare scholarships.

THE EVALUATION SYSTEM

- ❖ The ratio of external and internal assessment is 70: 30.
- ❖ The Examination cell takes the responsibility of conducting two internal assessment examinations i.e., for 20 marks. The question paper and answer sheets are provided by the Examination cell. The average will be taken for 20 marks.5 marks for assignments and 5 marks for attendance will be given making total 30 marks for internal assessment. There will be no minimum mark or re-examination for internal assessment.
- ❖ The examination cell invites all the departments to submit the completed internal award sheets for each subject at the end of each semester. These marks are consolidated through software solutions.


